





# Room: Chatham GIVING SAFETY A COMPETITIVE ADVANTAGE

Speakers: Rebecca Weil & Julie Sorensen (NEC), Luis Catala and Ed Dennehy (FPSS). Falls overboard are the leading cause of death in the Northeast lobster fishery, according to the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) Center for Maritime Safety and Health Studies, and could largely be prevented with the regular use of personal flotation devices (PFDs). In response, collaboration is underway with the Northeast Center for Occupational Health and Safety (NEC), Fishing Partnership Support Services (FPSS), and Northeast lobstermen- to identify and re-design PFDs that can work for this specific fishing sector.

During this seminar, we will discuss and showcase PFD designs that are currently

available and that could be used by lobster fishermen. We will also discuss key components of PFD design-providing an overview of topics related to PFDs, personal locating beacons (PLB), and associated safety techniques and gear. In addition, presenters will gather input from the audience to identify PFD/PLB features they like / don't like, barriers to use and the potential to combine life-saving features with value-added components that can add to work-efficiency or comfort. There will be an opportunity to try on various models of newer PFDs, and to discuss additional issues around falls overboard (such as prevention, re-boarding, being found). # **11:00 AM** *Room: Chatham* Tablets and Temperature Loggers Collecting Data with the CFRF Lobster & Jonah Crab Research Fleet

Presenters: Anna Mercer, PhD, CFRF Executive Director & CFRF Lobster & Jonah Crab Research Fleet participants

It is no secret that there is a severe lack of biological lobster and Jonah crab data from outside of state waters, where the majority of the fisheries are located. To address this issue, the Commercial Fisheries Research Foundation (CFRF) developed the Lobster and Jonah Crab Research Fleet, which provides lobstermen with the tools to collect critically needed biological data for lobster and Jonah crab from data poor areas, particularly offshore. Participants use a specialized tablet app (On Deck Data), digital calipers, and wireless water temperature sensors to record information about their catch and the environment as part of their routine fishing practices. Currently, 14 fishing vessels based out of Rhode Island, Massachusetts, and New Hampshire are involved in the program.

Differently from many other sampling programs, the fishermen that participate in the CFRF's Lobster and Jonah Crab Research Fleet retain ownership of their data and regularly receive personalized data reports. In addition, the data from the Research Fleet is systematically shared with scientists and used extensively to fill data gaps for both lobster and Jonah crab. In the future, the CFRF hopes to expand both the geographic coverage and scope of the project to address remaining data needs. This seminar will focus on discussing the past, present, and future of the Lobster and Jonah Crab Research Fleet and how to get involved. For more information visit www.cfrfoundation.org

Provided I can get off the rock I live on called Friendship Long Island, I plan to join you at the Massachusetts Lobstermen's Association Annual Meeting. I want to share what I've learned in 33 years studying lobster behavior and ecology. What I've observed makes me think there is a lot we can do to help lobsters cope with climate change. # Room: Chatham What Next for Right Whales and Pot/Trap Fisheries?

Presenters: Dr. Mark Baumgartner, WHOI and President, North Atlantic Right Whale Consortium – An Overview of Recent Studies of North Atlantic Right Whales Tim Werner/Amy Knowlton, NEAq – Updates on Collaborative Research with MA Lobster Fishermen on Whale Release Rope

Recent scientific studies of the North Atlantic right whale all signal a species requiring urgent conservation attention. The encouraging average population growth rate of 2.8% that the species experienced between 1990 and 2010, during which the population grew from 295 to 500 individuals, is now declining. This trend is explained in part by deaths resulting from entanglements in fishing ropes and depressed reproduction caused by chronic entanglements. Both the incidence, severity and lethality of entanglements have grown in recent years. The decline of the species is occurring despite recent reductions in deaths from ship strikes, as well as the adoption by the fishing industry of several regulatory measures (including weak links, sinking ground lines, vertical line reduction and area closures) that the National Marine Fisheries Service has implemented over many years to aid the recovery of right whales. Under these circumstances, we can anticipate increased regulation of the lobster fishery, which historically has included area closures when alternative fishing gear and practices that are beneficial to both fishermen and whales could not be advanced. During this seminar, marine scientists from the New England Aquarium and the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution will present results from new research on North Atlantic right whales, all of which show agreement about a species in peril. A facilitated group discussion will then focus on identifying potential solutions, such as alternative fishing practices, to help avoid regulatory measures that are least favorable to fishermen

### Room: Chatham Settlement- and environment-based fishery recruitment forecasts for the American lobster fishery in the Gulf of Maine and Southern New England

Presenter: Noah G. Oppenheim Accurate predictions of fishery recruitment represent the holy grail of fisheries science and management, but often those relationships are difficult to determine. As is true for many lobster fisheries, spawner-recruit relationships for the American lobster (Homarus americanus) in the northwest Atlantic have been particularly elusive to science. However, settler-recruit relationships, which track cohorts after larvae have settled to the sea bed, have shown a great deal of promise for recruitment forecasts in several crustacean species. Here we describe a fishery recruitment forecasting model based on the American Lobster Settlement Index (ALSI), a comprehensive annual diverbased survey that quantifies the abundance of young-of-year lobsters as they populate coastal nurseries. The model begins with the settlement index to set initial year-class strength and subjects cohorts to variable growth as determined by bottom temperature regimes, as well as proxies for natural mortality including predator abundance and shell disease prevalence. Projections are validated against independent indicators of recruitment to the fishery. This talk will describe our model development to date. Forecasts for the Gulf of Maine indicate moderate to significant declines in landings within the next five to eight years, while Southern New England landings are projected to remain relatively stable at low levels. We anticipate the projection models such as this will contribute to the stock assessment process and allow stakeholders to make informed decisions relating to the management of this fishery.

On May 19, 1942 a German U-boat in the Gulf of Mexico stalked its prey 40 miles off New Orleans. Captained by 29-year-old Erich Wurdemann, the submarine commander had his sights set on the freighter Heredia with 62 souls on board. Most of the crew were merchant seamen, but there were also a handful of civilians including the Downs family. The family was comprised of the parents, Ray Sr. and Ina, along with their two children, eight-year-old Ray Jr., nick-named "Sonny", and eleven-year-old Lucille.

Fast asleep in their berth the Downs family had no warning that two torpedoes were heading their way. When the ship exploded, all four members of the family were separated in the chaotic 2 a.m. event. More than half the crew and passengers aboard the Heredia perished, but incredibly, after 15 hours in the ocean – facing sharks, hypothermia, drowning, and dehydration—all of the Downs family survived and were

reunited. Ray Downs Jr. aka "Sonny" who lives in Massachusetts is now 82 years old but remembers every detail of the voyage, the attack, and his family's miraculous survival. The captain and senior crew members of the Heredia were all Massachusetts natives.

#### *Room: Chatham* **Real-time telemetry of ocean temperatures and weather from commercial fishing vessels**

The Environmental Monitors on Lobster Traps (eMOLT) Program is now collaborating with NOAA's Northeast Cooperative Research Study Fleet Program on a real-time telemetry project where data is automatically transmitted when the gear is hauled on deck. Preliminary experiments have included bottom temperature and weather observations. Results are displayed on a customized 7" screen in the wheelhouse, processed, and relayed to a Woods Hole server where they are then available on-line. Given a series of grants from NOAA's Fisheries Advanced Sampling Program and NOAA's National Weather Service, the equipment is supplied to interested fishermen at no cost. While still in its infancy, the objective of this project is to assimilate the data into ocean and weather models. Jim Manning (NOAA Woods Hole) will demo the equipment and make the presentation along with Tom Shyka (Northeastern Regional Association of Coastal Ocean Observing System).
