INCIDENTAL TAKE PERMIT

The Massachusetts Division of Marine Fisheries (MADMF) submitted the Incidental Take Permit (ITP) second draft application on Friday July 12, 2024, to National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) for a second review before the Final Application is submitted. Once the FINAL ITP application is ready for submission there will then be a 60-day comment period for the publics input. Remember, the Massachusetts State waters commercial mixed species trap/pot is listed as a NOAA Category II fishery https://www.fisheries.noaa.gov/ national/marine-mammal-protection/list-fisheries-summarytables#table-2-category-ii as you are currently fishing under the strictest regulations in the Country and have reduced risk by upwards of 90%. If NMFS cannot issue the ITP to Massachusetts, then who can they?

RIGHT WHALE CALVING

The North Atlantic right whale calving season begins each year in mid-November and ends around mid-April. With only 70 reproduc-

tive female North Atlantic right whales remaining, we keep a close watch on them and their new calves to help ensure their survival. Considering these current numbers, 20 new calf births would be considered a relatively productive calving season. However, given the high rate of mortality and injury, North Atlantic right whales need to have at least 50 new calves per year to recover and grow their population. If the species fell to only 50 reproductive females, they would become functionally extinct.

Veterans with disabilities honored with 66th annual fishing & boating trip

Around 200 local veterans with end of the event. disabilities were treated to a day of fishing and boating off Houghs Neck on Wednesday afternoon, part of the 66th annual Harvey's Saltwater Fishing Club veterans' fishing trip.

Club president Kevin Gomez said it's a cause close to his heart.

"It's a great feeling," Gomez told Boston 25 News. "I have a lot of veterans in my family. My father was in Vietnam. My grandfather was in World War II. I have an uncle who was killed in Vietnam. It means a lot to me and everyone I know to show these people the honor and respect they deserve."

More than 100 volunteers came out to support the annual fishing trip, including 20 vessels ranging from lobster to harbor cruise boats. All supplies are donated or paid for through fundraising, including a catered dinner at the

Veterans and volunteers look forward to the event months in advance, Gomez said.

"Some of these guvs are in the hospital all year long, and this is one of the days they get to go out," said Gomez. "Some of these people look forward to this all year long."

Paul Urbanus remembers the early days. He was one of the original volunteers.

"We started with only two or three boats," Urbanus recalled.

While interest, volunteers, and donations have all grown, Urbanus said the sense of gratitude and unity has always remained the same.

"The country is in a tough situation right now," Urbanus said, adding political affiliations seem to fall by the wayside once you're on the water. "The idea is we're one."

Boat captain Dan Morrell is both



a veteran and a volunteer. He said what he gives, he also receives.

"Every time I've had them on the boat, they've loved it," Morrell said. "What they don't realize

Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution Announces Shift of Ocean Alkalinity Enhancement Field Trials to Summer 2025

Change was made in response to ship availability and to resulting changes in ocean conditions later in the year

WOODS HOLE, MA (AUGUST 14, 2024) -Today, the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution (WHOI) announced that the next phase of the LOC-NESS Project, a research program focused on advancing a potential climate solution called ocean alkalinity enhancement (OAE), will be shifted from this Fall to the summer of 2025. The phase consists of a controlled and monitored OAE field trial in federal waters off the coast of Massachusetts, and it has received significant support from leading scientists, top academic institutions, and environmental advocacy organizations.

This decision to shift from the anticipated mid-September 2024 timing was made because the fullyequipped research vessel WHOI planned to use is no longer available. WHOI explored finding a potential replacement vessel, but it was not unavailable until late September, with possibility of additional delays due to the anticipated active hurricane season. Researchers concluded that the ocean conditions this late in the season would be significantly less favorable for the research, which is dependent on warmer ocean temperatures.

The LOC-NESS project aims to provide an objective assessment of the effectiveness and environmental impact of OAE, a potential climate solution that leading scientists believe could remove large amounts of excess carbon dioxide from the atmosphere, and fill knowledge gaps that can contribute to addressing climate change. Some of the world's leading scientific bodies, including the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change and National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine, have called for a concerted effort to study climate solutions like OAE before they are

18 months, the U.S. federal government has invested tens of millions of dollars into improving knowledge about a wide range of oceanclimate solutions. In addition, the White House created a Fast-Track Action Committee (FTAC) on Marine Carbon Dioxide Removal to coordinate research and funding activities across federal agencies.

"The goal of the LOC-NESS project is to advance foundational knowledge of OAE through rigorous, transparent science," said Adam Subhas, Associate Scientist in Marine Chemistry and Geochemistry at WHOI, and Project Lead of LOC-NESS. "This particular field trial aims to expand our understanding of the effectiveness and potential environmental impacts of ocean alkalinity enhancement. We're shifting our timeline to account for factors that were beyond our control and that we felt would lead to less-than-optimal weather conditions for the test. We want to make sure that when we do this research, the conditions allow for meaningful and useful results."

"Research expeditions are often postponed due to weather, or to crew implemented at scale. Over the last and equipment availability, and this mass of water in the open ocean.

project is no different," Subhas continued. "We're excited to be among the growing field of scientists working hand-in-hand with the government, philanthropy, and local communities to advance ocean-climate solutions, and we look forward to conducting the field research next year. In the meantime, our project will continue coordinating with state and federal officials, conducting lab work, and reaching out to those who want to know more about our project."

The Environmental Protection Agency is currently reviewing the LOC-NESS project's permit for this phase of research and the subsequent phase. This phase was originally planned for August 2024, but it was pushed back to mid-September due to the extension of the EPA's public comment period, which WHOI fully supported. Given this phase's shift to 2025, the next phase planned for the Gulf of Maine has now been scheduled for 2026. Last year, an initial field trial was successfully conducted South of Cape Cod. That initial trial involved the release of inert dye to improve scientists' ability to track a specific

- What happened to the research vessel? The planned OAE field trial was originally scheduled for August on the R/V Connecticut operated by the University of Connecticut. The extension of the EPA's public comment period related to the permit, which WHOI supported, necessitated a shift to September. That required a change in vessel to the R/V Hugh Sharp operated by the University of Delaware. Last week, WHOI was notified that the R/V Sharp is no longer available for the September time period and no suitable replacement could be found before the end of September.
- Why can't the field trial happen later in 2024? Obtaining highquality results during this phase of research requires a warmer surface layer of water. That layering, or stratification, is important because it allows the added alkaline material to remain in the upper ocean, where it will stay in contact with the atmosphere and draw carbon dioxide into the ocean. This allows scientists to obtain accurate measurements about the uptake of carbon dioxide by alkalinity-enhanced seawater, which is a key scientific objective of the LOC-NESS project. Conducting the field research in late September or early October, let alone later in the year, is not feasible because the warmer surface layer disappears as Fall progresses.

An Act relative to lobstering closure mitigation update is stalled on the Hill!

As of August 20, 2024, Senate Bill No. 552 An Act relative to lobstering closure mitigation has not been passed. While we knew going into the legislative session it would be an uphill climb as there are limited options for avenues to pass this Bill.

Whereas, the end of the Formal Session has come and gone with no resolutions, Senator Patrick O'Connor and his staff are not giving up on this and nor should you. The Bill is NOT dead on the Hill!

While some legislators question the cost of it, and where will these funds come from, we keep encouraging the legislators to pass this to help preserve the historic and iconic commercial lobster industry here in the Commonwealth. We will keep you posted on this as the Bill continues to climb the Hill through the arduous process and in the meantime, keep calling your legislators to support Senate Bill No. 552.

An Act relative to lobstering closure mitigation. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 130 of the general laws is hereby amended by adding the following

2 section:-

- 3 Section 37B. Lobstering Closure Mitigation Fund
- 4 (a) There shall be established and set up on the books of the Commonwealth, subject to
- 5 appropriation, a fund to be known as the Lobstering Closure Mitigation Fund to be administered
- 6 by the department of unemployment assistance.
- 7 (b) The purpose of the Fund shall be to provide financial assistance to lobstermen to
- 8 mitigate the financial impacts of fishing area closures due to protection of endangered marine
- 9 species. For the purposes of this act, the term "lobsterman" shall mean a holder of a commercial
- 10 fisherman permit (lobster) as so appearing in section 38 of this chapter that is deemed to be
- 11 active and transferable by the director, and the term "trap" shall mean a lobster trap or pot used
- 12 to catch lobsters that is owned by and licensed under and a lobsterman. Any lobsterman who is
- 13 domiciled in Massachusetts shall be eligible for weekly payments equal to one dollar per trap per
- 14 week. Eligibility for said payments shall be available through February 1 and shall terminate on

15 July 30 annually.

- 16 (c) There shall be credited to the Fund all amounts that are, by law, transferred or
- 17 authorized to be transferred thereto or directed to be deposited therein, and all amounts received
- 18 as gifts, grants, or contributions for the purposes of the Fund. Amounts credited to the Fund shall
- 19 not be subject to further appropriation and any money remaining in the Fund at the end of a fiscal
- 20 year shall not revert to the General Fund.
- 21 (d) The director of the department shall report annually to the house and senate
- 22 committees on ways and means and the joint committee on environment natural resources and
- 23 agriculture on income received into the fund and sources of that income, any expenditure from
- 24 the fund and their purposes, and fund balances.
- 25 (e) The department shall promulgate regulations as necessary to implement the provisions
- 26 of this section, including, but not limited to, regulations pertaining to payment application and
- 27 disbursement procedures.
- 28 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

American Lobster Board Initiates Addendum to Postpone Implementation of Addendum XXVII Measures & Approves Addendum XXX

ARLINGTON, VA – The Commission's American Lobster Management Board initiated Draft Addendum XXXI to Amendment 3 to the Interstate Fishery Management Plan for American Lobster. The Draft Addendum will consider postponing the implementation of the measures from Addendum XXVII. The Board also approved Addendum XXX, which addresses how the measures of Addendum XXVII will apply to foreign imports of American lobster once implemented.

Draft Addendum XXXI considers postponing the implementation of management measures under Sections 3.1 and 3.2 of Addendum XXVII until July 1, 2025. Addendum XXVII was adopted in May 2023 and established a trigger mechanism to automatically implement management measures to provide additional protection of the Gulf of Maine/Georges Bank (GOM/GBK) spawning stock biomass. Changes to the current gauge and escape vent sizes in Lobster Conservation Management Areas (LCMAs) 1, 3, and Outer Cape Cod (OCC) were triggered based on observed changes in recruit abundance indices in October 2023 with the inclusion of 2022 survey data in the trigger index. The Board then extended the implementation date of the series of changes to gauge and vent size to begin January 1, 2025 to allow the Gulf of Maine states the opportunity to coordinate with Canada regarding possible trade implications, and give the industry and gauge makers additional time to prepare for these changes.

A meeting was held between US and Canadian lobster fishery managers and industry members in June 2024 to discuss the management structures and stock assessments of the two countries. Based on this meeting, the Board determined that postponing implementation of Addendum XXVII's biological measures to July 1, 2025 would reduce negative impacts to the US and Canadian lobster industries in 2025 and allow Canada more time to consider implementing complementary management measures. Specifically, Draft Addendum XXXI will consider postponing the changes in minimum gauge size for LCMA 1 (inshore Gulf of Maine), and the measures under Section 3.1 of Addendum XXVII to create a common size limit for stateonly and federal permit holders fishing in OCC to July 2025. The Draft Addendum will not consider postponing regulations prohibiting the issuance of 10% additional trap tags in Areas 1 and 3 above the trap limit or allocation. Draft Addendum XXXI will be released for public comment later this year.

The Board also approved Addendum XXX, which clarifies the Commission's intent for how the measures of Addendum XXVII will apply to foreign imports of American lobster once implemented. The Addendum recommends to NOAA Fisheries that the Mitchell Provision of the Magnuson-Stevens Act apply to foreign imports of whole live lobster, meaning the smallest minimum size for foreign imports would match the smallest minimum size in effect for the US industry. The current smallest LCMA minimum gauge size in effect is 3¹/₄ inches, and when the LCMA 1 gauge size increases, this will change to 3 5/16 inches. Foreign imports smaller than the new minimum gauge size would be prohibited. These size restrictions do not apply to lobsters travelling in-bond through the US.

"Grappling with Technology"

The Lobster Foundation of Massachusetts, (LFoM) has completed a rigorous contractual process with the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation to begin working on its project, "Grappling with Technology" (Project) to develop a cost-effective solution for grappling with GPS location devices to allow the commercial lobstermen to fish during the closed season to further protect the North Atlantic Right Whales (NARW).

Once these technologies are integrated the commercial lobster industry will begin field testing grappling with the use of these technological platforms.

The Project is looking to work with 15 commercial lobstermen and mobile gear fishermen in MA LMA2, to test gears the ability to address both fishing gear conflict and NARW.

The Project team will train the commercial lobstermen and mobile gear fishermen to use the "Grappling with Technology" gear.

The Massachusetts Lobstermen's Association (MLA) Legal Defense Fund (LDF) needs your support now more than ever. This dedicated fund is for the purpose of defending the Massachusetts commercial lobster fishermen from legal and fisheries management actions that could seriously impact our commercial lobstermen's ability to conduct their businesses and earn a living.

Currently, the MLA is actively engaged in lawsuits that could have negative impacts on the commercial lobster industry and is working with our lawyers in the Commonwealth and in Minnesota to fight for you and your industry

UPDATE 8/28/2024 (District of Massachusetts / First Circuit Case) Case No. 1:24-cv-10332-WGY; MLA v. NMFS et al / First Circuit Case Nos. 24-1480 and 24-1481

Last year NMFS illegally extended the 2022 Wedge Closure to close the Wedge from February through April 2023. We challenged this decision in Court and the Court agreed we were right on the law, but ultimately decided not to stop it because we could not show irreparable harm. NMFS is now at it again, attempting to convert its illegal 2023 Wedge Closure into a Permanent Final Rule. We submitted a robust comment to the proposed final regulation explaining to NMFS why its proposed final rule is illegal.

Despite this, NMFS proceeded with the illegal wedge closure, ignoring Congress' clear mandate not to further regulate the lobster industry and relying on the same illegal science that the D.C. Circuit struck down. We moved for a preliminary injunction to stop this before it could go into effect this season. The Court held a trial on our case on March 14, 2024.

We are pleased to announce that we scored a massive win in this case. The Court ruled that the Consolidated Appropriations Act. 2023, clearly forbid NMFS from implementing the Permanent Wedge Closure and declared that the Rule was illegal, thus leaving the Wedge open until 2028. The Court also correctly identified the severe harm our members would face if NMFS was allowed to violate the law like this.

We filed a motion for attorney's fees under the Equal Access to Justice Act on April 12, 2024. The Court has stayed briefing on that issue so that we can negotiate with NMFS regarding our

28 requested fees. That stay has been expanded to last until the appeal process has finishes.

On the subject of the appeal, NMFS appealed the decision to the First Circuit. The NGOs, which the Court allowed to join the case after its decision and over our objection, have also filed an appeal. They have moved for the Court to consolidate the appeals, a decision we did not oppose. We expect the First Circuit to rule on that motion this month. From there, the Court will set a briefing schedule for the parties.

We brought a motion to dismiss NMFS's appeal. While unusual for appeals, our basis for doing so is well founded. In any case it loses, the government cannot simply bring an appeal. Instead, it must get approval from the Solicitor General within the 60-day window for appealing. Here, NMFS admitted that it failed to do this. Because of this failure, the appeal was never authorized and cannot be allowed. NMFS opposed the motion, claiming the Solicitor General could approve an appeal after the deadline. The First Circuit declined to rule ahead of time, instead asking Parties to include this argument in their principal Briefs.

NMFS and the NGOs have filed their principal Briefs, making effectively the same arguments that were made to the District of Massachusetts. Our responsive brief is due on September 16, 2024, we have a single combined brief that will respond to both, and the First Circuit granted us additional words in order to do so. The NGOs and NMFS will then get short reply briefs to respond to our arguments.

UPDATE 8/28/2024 (Rhode Island Superior Court) Case No. PC-2024-02162; East Farm Commercial Fisheries Center v. Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management et al.

Recently, our brother lobstermen in Rhode Island scored a great victory against the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management's attempt to place a mandatory VMS requirement on federally-licensed lobstermen. Represented by Eckland & Blando, the same law firm that represents us. the Rhode Island lobstermen obtained a preliminary injunction forbidding RIDEM from implementing the mandatory VMS requirement on federallylicensed lobstermen.

The Rhode Island Superior Court based its ruling on two grounds: (1) the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 forbid the passage of new regulations

on lobstermen until 2028 and the VMS Rule violated that prohibition; and (2) Congress has "pre-empted" Rhode Island from passing any regulation on federally-licensed lobstermen as NMFS is the sole entity that may do so. This ruling relied heavily on our win in the District of Massachusetts case and could have wide ranging implications for lobstermen in other states as well.

We are reviewing this decision with our legal team to determine next steps following this win by the Rhode Island lobstermen.

The commercial lobstermen's businesses are at stake as well as the thousands of jobs and shore side businesses that depend upon the continued success of the commercial lobster industry.
